## Kindergarten News

Religion class in November centers around learning about saints and giving thanks to God for all the good things that He gives us. We learn to appreciate the special gifts of family, friends, food and shelter.

We will be learning to recite the prayer, *Grace Before Meals*. Each child is asked to bring a canned good to school to make a food basket for a needy family.

Reading will concentrate on phonic sounds and children will explore picture detail, recall events from a story, help to complete

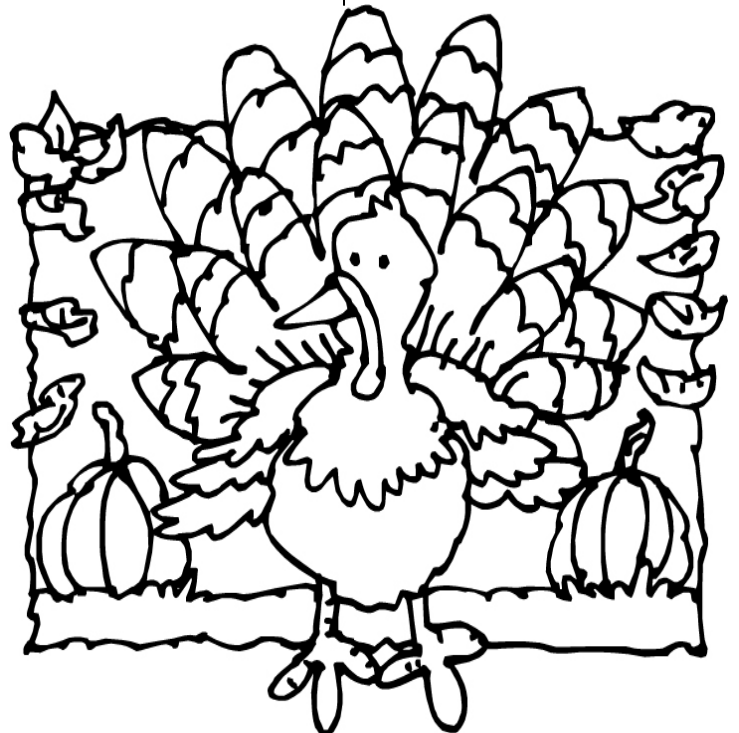
rhyming verses, explore sequence, and make predictions.

Our new unit in Math will be, "Understanding Numbers through Ten." We will use objects to represent and count 6-10, to write the numbers and order them in sequence. We will also be using the words sixth through tenth to identify ordinal positions. We will practice our patterning as we string Indian beads.

Social Studies class will center on a unit about Pilgrims and Indians. We will re-enact the First Thanksgiving feast and make

butter, paper turkeys, and draw Indian pictographs in our journals.

I am looking forward to talking to all the parents at November conferences!



## First Grade News

During the month of November, students in first grade will study many subjects through our cross curricular unit on Pilgrims and Native Americans. They will learn why the pilgrims came to this country, and the hardships they endured.

We will study geography, and learn to name and find the continents on the globe, in particular North America and Europe.

Students will talk about the cultural differences between these two groups of people, styles of living, clothing, foods

and many others.

First graders will have the chance to read about these topics while sitting in our Native American teepee Reading center.

They will learn to distinguish between wants and needs, as we talk about what the pilgrims needed to survive, and compare these to our own blessings of today.

In Religion, we will focus on sharing what we have with others who are less fortunate. Students will learn addition sums to twelve,

and continue subtraction as well.

We will continue sentence writing, and the students will learn to navigate their way through a website on the computers in the lab, as well as some basic key-boarding.

We will continue in our Reading series, learning about main ideas, details, problems and solutions.

We will also be scheduling parent/teacher conferences this month, so I look forward to meeting with each of you soon!

## Second Grade News

I hope that everyone had a wonderful Halloween! November is going to be a very busy and exciting month for second grade! At the beginning of the month we will be starting cursive writing.

We just began our second unit in Scholastic Reading called Super Solvers. In each story there is more than one way to solve a problem. We are continuing to improve our word recognition skills as we read.

Our grammar lessons will be focusing on the parts of a sentence, nouns, pronouns, and verbs.

In Math, we will be working on place value to the hundreds. We will also be learning how to count money. Please continue to practice memorizing basic addition and subtraction facts with your child at home.

This month in science we will be learning that

plants and animals depend on each other for food. In class we will be looking at pictures of food webs and food chains.

In Social Studies we will be recognizing and describing landforms. We will also be reading stories about the Pilgrims and the first Thanksgiving.

Time and graphing will be our math themes. Also, we will continue to practice our basic facts. In social studies, we will learn about other cultures and how they celebrate different occasions. Lastly, our science studies will continue to focus on the plant and animal kingdoms.

November will be both busy and fun for fourth graders. In math, we will learn beginning algebra, and division.

We are learning the ecosystem of both living and nonliving worlds in science.

In Religion the students will learn the Commandments and how they are laws of God for us to follow.

In ELA we will continue getting ready for the exam in January by practicing our listening and writing skills.

In Reading the students will read "The Doughnut" by Robert McCloskey and "Wings" by Jane Yolen.

Keyboarding will continue to be our focus for technology.

Iroquois and Algonquin Indians will be our study for Social Studies.

## From the Classroom of Miss Neal

Happy Thanksgiving to one and all!

5<sup>th</sup> Grade ELA: Our November unit is titled; It's a Mystery. The stories in this unit include; Red-headed League, The Case of the Secret Message, The Secrets of Veruivius, and Sky Pioneer. Throughout this unit, the students will be working on comprehension (understanding the use of flashbacks, mood, metaphors, summarizing, comparing and contrasting and reviewing the plot), vocabulary and writing.

5<sup>th</sup> Grade Math: In chapters 3 and 4 we will be working on dividing whole numbers with one and two divisors. When dividing whole numbers we will address: patterns, estimating quotients and how to check their work. Please continue to work with your child on all math facts!

Technology: We are working on Type to Learn 3 for keyboarding. I also will use Inspiration. I continue to make great use of the Scholastic Website for my Grade 5 class-page. I

hope you are logging onto the Scott Foresman website, [www.sfsuccessnet.com](http://www.sfsuccessnet.com)

to take advantage of the math enrichment activities.

5<sup>th</sup> Grade Science: We are working on Chapter 3: Human Body Systems.

We will learn about the circulatory system, respiratory system, digestive and urinary systems.

6<sup>th</sup> Grade Math: We are working on Fractions. In this chapter we will use our knowledge of GCF (Greatest Common Fac-

tor) and LCM (Least Common Multiple) to help us in adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers, estimating sums and differences of fractions and mixed numbers before moving on to multiplying and dividing fractions.

6<sup>th</sup> Grade Science: We are working on Chapter 10: Reshaping the Earth's Surface. We will investigate how the earth's surface changes, the affect water has on the Earth's features and the affect waves have on coastal landforms.

## From the Classroom of Mrs. Burns

Sixth Grade welcomes student teacher, Amanda Love, to our classroom for the month of November. We look forward to her engaging learning in our room.

In religion, this month we continue the Old Testament patriarchs. Towards the end of the month we will review the characters of the Old Testament and the Salvation History as we prepare to make our Jesse tree symbols for the month of December.

We are finishing up our Ancient Egypt Unit and are beginning

to study the Ancient Greek Civilization. We connect that civilization to the Letters of St. Paul to the different Greek communities, Corinth, Thessalonians, etc...

During the month of November, in fifth grade, we are reviewing for the New York State Test in Social Studies. We are practicing writing constructive response and document based questions.

We continue our study of the seven sacraments in religion class.

We are preparing

for the New York State exam in ELA. We are using a program called New York State ELA Coach and English 6 Extreme Review.

We continue reading and writing book reports and interpreting poems. We complete "Daily Paragraph Editing" every day.

We just finished essays on the life of St. Marguerite D'Youville which are displayed on the wall in front of the library.

We used technology to publish the essays

and make timelines of October Saints. The students saved pictures which they inserted into their essays.

We also have been using a site called "Wacky Web tales", where the students substitute different parts of speech completing a story. The finished product is actually quite funny.

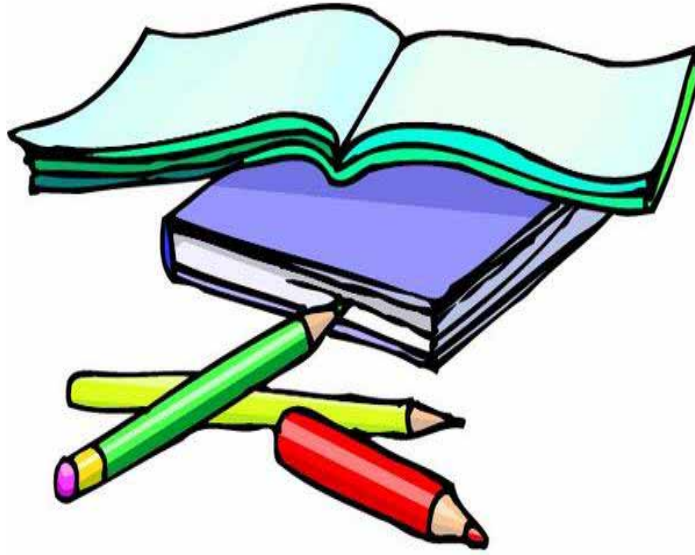
